



2020 Annual Crime Security and Fire Report

The Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security and Crime Statistics Act is a consumer protection law that aims to provide transparency around campus crime policy and statistics. The Clery Act requires all colleges and universities that participate in federal financial aid programs to keep and disclose information about crime on and near their respective campuses. Compliance is monitored by the Department of Education.

The report, even though brief in its nature is to work with other local authorities and provide general information but allow the reader to contact the administration for specific information if needed.

The Department of Education mandates all colleges and universities that receive federal funding to disseminate the Annual Security and Fire Safety Report no later than October 1 of each year but the federal government has revised the deadline for this year only, to December 31, 2020, due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The report must be disseminated to every member of the campus community. Prospective students and employees may find the report on the CCC website. The College provides the student community with the report in hard copy located in the library.

CCC campus is one building adjacent only to an empty storage unit and residential homes. The nature of the college serving the local community does not come equipped with the traditional norms of a college campus.

The policy for reporting crime is through our local police department and notification to a senior staff member. As reported through the Campus Security Authorities the College reported zero crime on campus and its adjacent neighbors.

The Campus Fire Safety Right-to-Know Act requires universities with on-campus housing to compile fire data, report the data to the federal government, and publish an annual fire safety report. The report should be distributed annual along with the annual crime safety report.

The College has fire extinguishers located throughout the facility that's reviewed periodically by the Fire Marshall for compliance. The College provided a fire extinguisher for students to keep within their dwelling if one was not provided.

The College keeps fire evacuation diagrams and lighted evacuation signs in each classroom.

- Fire prevention
- Evacuation routes
- Emergency contacts
- Reporting of fire
